

- The bicycles change lives forever by improving basic mobility for access to health care and education, and increasing economic productivity. The container then becomes a pre-built bicycle workshop providing employment opportunities.
- Bicycles for Humanity, Melbourne is an incorporated association and registered charity with ACNC and registered for fundraising within Victoria, Australia.
- Volunteer Board of Directors provide governance and guidance, with the Volunteer Leadership Team managing operations.



Chair's Report – Mike Harley

- Embedded the new operating model in line with our Mission and Values through our Committee structures with continued improvement relationships building across our volunteer base

- During the year, the Board was able to improve the corporate governance of B4H Melbourne by among others:
 - Monitor and address risks noted on the register - particular focus on Africa operations and. the future financial viability or BENN
 - Update the Rules of Association including membership list and the "friends of B4H" list
 - Review, update and add organisational policies as required such as OHS, volunteer engagement etc.
 - Colin Lai continued his role of Board Secretary, keeping us all in line, and joined as a Director
 - Amanda James resigned from the board – continues to be a part of the B4H Community

FY24 P&L

Donations for the year totalled \$106k (FY23: \$103k) , with Slipstream representing the largest individual contributor at \$49k (\$94k lifetime) of this, and bike sales representing \$27.1k.

With the exception of freight, costs were in-line with historic levels. Freight was an historic high again in F24 (\$39k, increase from FY23 \$35k) as a backlog had built up, with one container shipped per each of the first three months of the FY, totalling 4 across the FY.

Balance Sheet as at 30 June 2024

B4H's financial position is strong, with \$180k cash at bank as at 30 June 2024, and no liabilities. Compliance submissions are up to date, and the organisation is appropriately insured.


B4H remains in a favourable cashflow control position, as B4H controls the timing of purchase and shipment of shipping containers (most material cost), such that the timing can be selected to minimise these costs. Furthermore, donation income continues to increase annually.




